

AFFIDAVIT AND NOTICE
OF REVOCATION
YOU MUST ACT WITHIN 7 DAYS

THIS IS A LEGAL DOCUMENT

Form with fields for Respondent's Name, Date of Birth, Address, Driver's License Number, Class, State, Social Security Number, Sex, Weight, Height, Hair, Eyes, Commercial Driver License, Commercial Motor Vehicle, Hazardous Materials, Accident, License Plate, State, Registered Owner Name and Address.

You are hereby notified that on this "date of notice, you were asked to submit to a test or tests to determine the alcohol and/or drug concentration within your system. The following constitute PROBABLE CAUSE to believe you were driving a motor vehicle under the influence of, or impaired by, alcohol or drugs or with a blood or breath alcohol content of 0.04 or more (Commercial/HAZMAT operator) or 0.10 or more, or at least 0.02 but less than 0.04 (Commercial/HAZMAT operator under age 21) or at least 0.02 but less than 0.10 (operator under age 21).

You were identified as the driver of a motor vehicle by [Name] at 0210 hours. You rear ended her vehicle at [Location]. You have an odor of an alcoholic beverage on your breath, your eyes are bloodshot and watery, your stance is poor needing support. You did poorly on roadside, HGN given by Officers Swint, Worley and Hobart. You refused to submit to a chemical test of your blood or breath by stating, "I don't want to" at 0310 hours.

ORDER OF REVOCATION (C.R.S. 42-2-126)

THIS IS YOUR OFFICIAL ORDER. Unless you request a hearing within seven (7) calendar days after this "date of notice, the Department of Revenue will enter this order effective the eighth (8th) day after the "date of notice. This order will remain in effect until the provisions of C.R.S. 42-2-132 are complied with, the required insurance form filed with, and a reinstatement fee is paid to the Department of Revenue. Upon reinstatement, you may be required to complete a written and drive test before a new driver license can be issued.

- Because you refused to take or complete, or to cooperate with the completing of any test or tests of your blood, breath, saliva, and/or urine, your driver's license and/or driving privilege is hereby revoked for a minimum period of ONE YEAR. (Commercial Vehicle Operator - ONE YEAR FOR FIRST OFFENSE, THREE YEARS IF HAZARDOUS MATERIAL VIOLATION OR LIFE FOR 2ND OFFENSE) (For a Regular Vehicle Operator - FIRST OFFENSE ONE YEAR, SECOND OFFENSE TWO YEARS, THIRD OR SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE THREE YEARS)
Because you submitted to testing which disclosed an alcohol concentration of 0.10 or more, your driver's license and/or driving privilege is hereby revoked for a minimum of THREE MONTHS FOR A FIRST REVOCATION or ONE YEAR FOR A SECOND or SUBSEQUENT REVOCATION.
COMMERCIAL/HAZMAT OPERATOR (only if operating a commercial/HAZMAT vehicle). Because you submitted to testing which disclosed an alcohol concentration of 0.04 or more, your driver's license and/or driving privilege is hereby revoked for a minimum of ONE YEAR FOR THE FIRST OFFENSE, THREE YEARS IF HAZMAT VIOLATION or LIFE FOR 2ND OFFENSE.
Because you are under age 21 and you submitted to testing which disclosed an alcohol concentration of at least 0.02 but less than 0.10, your driver's license and/or driving privilege is hereby revoked for a minimum of THREE MONTHS FOR A FIRST REVOCATION, SIX MONTHS FOR A SECOND REVOCATION or ONE YEAR FOR A THIRD or SUBSEQUENT REVOCATION.
COMMERCIAL/HAZMAT OPERATORS UNDER AGE 21 (only if operating a commercial/HAZMAT vehicle). Because you submitted to testing which disclosed an alcohol concentration of at least 0.02 but less than 0.04, your driver's license and/or driving privilege is hereby revoked for a minimum of THREE MONTHS FOR A FIRST REVOCATION, SIX MONTHS FOR A SECOND REVOCATION or ONE YEAR FOR A THIRD or SUBSEQUENT REVOCATION.

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO REQUEST A HEARING (C.R.S. 42-2-126 (B))

Your written request for a hearing and a driver's license must be received by the Colorado Department of Revenue within seven (7) calendar days after "date of notice. You can make a request for a hearing at any Colorado Department of Revenue Motor Vehicle Division Driver's License Office. A temporary permit may be issued until the date of your first scheduled hearing. If your written request and driver's license are not received by the Colorado Department of Revenue within seven (7) calendar days after "date of notice, you waive your right to a hearing and the Department's determination is final. Unless previously surrendered, any driver's license in your possession must be surrendered at the time of the hearing request before a hearing will be granted.

SURRENDER OF DRIVER'S LICENSE

By law [Section 42-2-126 (3)(c)], the officer is required to take possession of any license held by you. When a valid driver's license is surrendered, the officer may issue a temporary permit which will remain in force for seven (7) calendar days after the "date of notice.

TEMPORARY PERMIT

This entire notice and order is a temporary permit which expires on the seventh (7th) day after the "date of notice when indicated below and when signed by both you and the peace officer.
